Publications on Psychosomatic Obstetrics and Gynaecology and the Journal of Psychosomatic Obstetrics and Gynaecology (JPOG)

Supporting both areas is a matter of course and the journal, with its Editors in Chief, Professor Julie Quinlivan – Dean of Medicine, Curtin University, Bentley, Australia and Mijke Lambregtsevan den Berg - Erasmus University Medical Center, Netherland, is on a very good path with a current Impact Factor of 3.2

A book project on the contents of our ISPOG Congress in Vienna is in preparation; after the summer holidays V. Pramataroff-Hamburger and M. Neises-Rudolf will continue the coordination we have started with a publisher.

Training the Experts

Last not least my special interest is providing these concepts, which I have offered during the congresses of the German Society, DGPFG und in specialized settings for Basic Psychosomatic Care in Psychosomatic Ob/Gyn. The German Concept involves a training in theory in psychosomatic diseases and psychic problems, communication sensitivity and competence and finally Balint Group training (all together 80h). This might become a part of ISPOG-Congresses and special lectures.

Change of Officers for the Board

At the General Assembly, the hammer of ISPOG was transferred by Leroy Edozien to Mechthild Neises-Rudolf. Sibil Tschudin stepped down as Immediate Past-president. M.Caroline Vos will continue as Secretary-General. Chulmin Lee was unanimously elected as President-elect. Since no nominations were send in for the position of Treasurer, the board proposed that Vivian Pramataroff-Hamburger will continue as Treasurer because of her excellent execution of her task. This was unanimously accepted.





Chulmin Lee is a professor in the Gynecologic Cancer Center in Cha University Ilsan Medical Center, South Korea, and has been an active gynecologic oncologist for more than 20 years. He has a long history of participation in gynecologic cancer societies and currently is a Vice President of the Korean Gynecologic Oncology Group. He is also experienced in medical education and served as the Vice Dean of Medical College of Inje University, South Korea. He has compassion with transgenders and LGBTQ people.

Standing committees on Education, Perinatology and Research

At ISPOG 2022, the results of the education survey as prepared by Jonathan Schaffir and Vivian Pramataroff-Hamburger were presented. Also, a draft for educational guidelines was prepared that needs further adjustment and refinement. Help for the educational committee is wanted!

The committee on Perinatology was revived with Vesna Gall as the new chair. She will also participate in the GAMMH initiative. However, she can't do this on her own. So for the perinatology committee also, help is urgently wanted.

ISPOG has a new standing committee on Research. This committee was installed at the General Assembly and we are happy to announce that it will be chaired by Sibil Tschudin, who has just stepped down as Immediate Past-President. The editors-in-chief of JPOG will also be a member. The plans for research by the committee will be presented at the coming ExCo meeting.

Treasurer's report

ISPOG has a healthy financial situation. In 2020, membership fees of 12.887,00 euro were collected. Total assets end of 2021 are \in 67.638,20 euro. Thank you very much to all of you who sent your fees on time.

Report Journal of Psychosomatic Obstetrics and Gynaecology

JPOG did very well over the past years. The impact factor has risen from 2.9 to 3.2. Article downloads increased by 24% to 133.042 downloads in 2021. The number of submissions has risen to almost 350. Therefore, acceptance rate has lowered to 11%. Mijke Lambregtse-van

den Berg, as one of the Editors-in-chief briefly explained the conversion to open access that will take place in 2023. Most important is that the articles of JPOG will be openly available. Several waivers for help with the article-processing-fees are possible in order to make sure to have high quality submissions from all over the world. If not immediately clear from the submission website, the editors can always help. Finally, help with reviewing articles is always welcome.
